How to bridge different identities?*

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
Abstract

Ethics reside at the core of the research process, motivating inquiry, guiding practice, and promoting an ethos of accountability and equity.

This workshop (co-hosted with the Chemistry Department) trains faculty, staff, and students in how to engage diversity for effective and equitable mentoring. Facilitated by Dr. Chris ChoGlueck (Ethics) and Dr. Sally Pias (Chemistry), we will discuss the benefits and challenges of diversity and explore case studies on mentoring across differences in the context of research.
