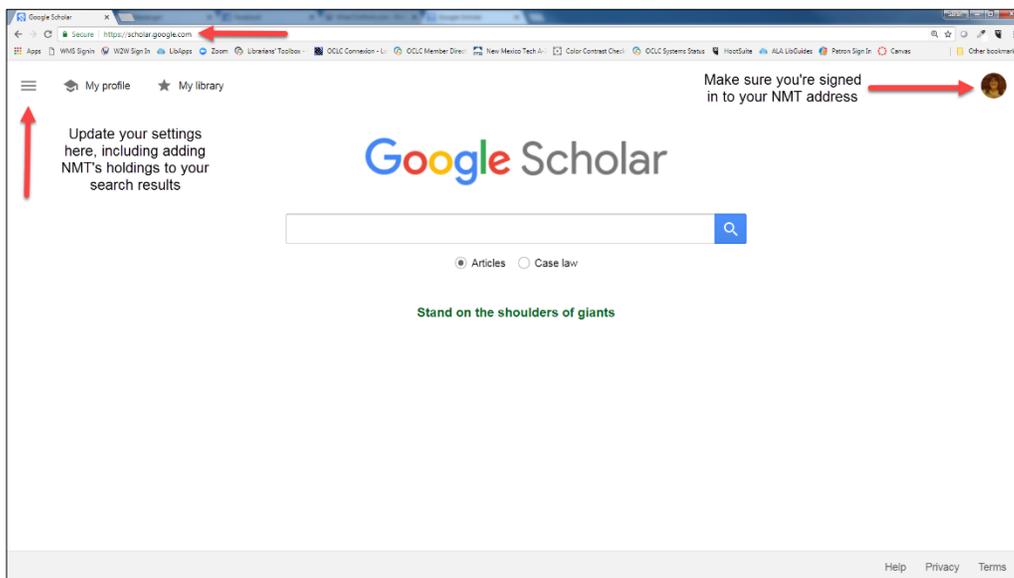


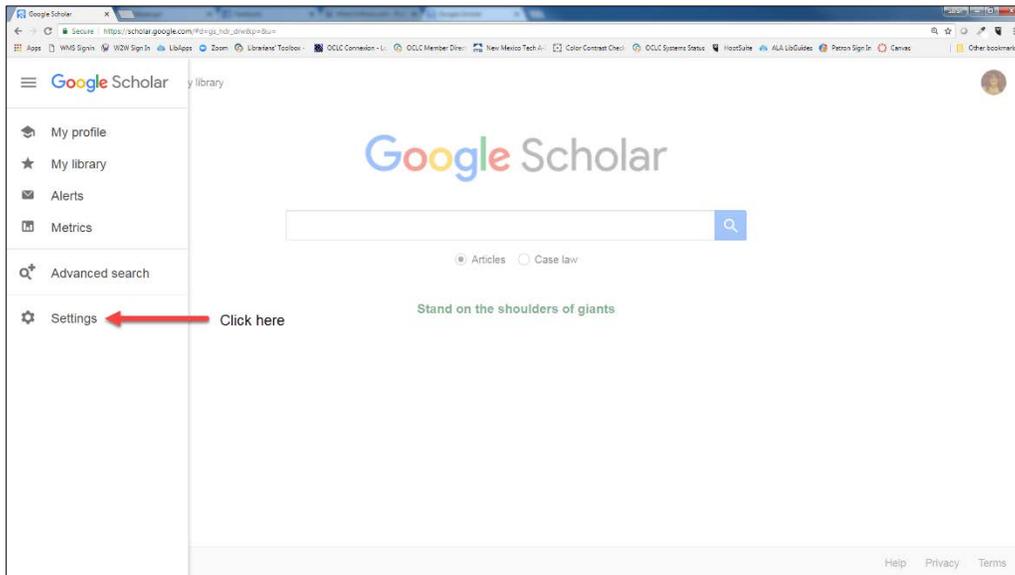
How to Connect Skeen Library's Resources to Google Scholar

Connecting Google Scholar to New Mexico Tech will automatically provide you access to subscription articles that the school already pays for.

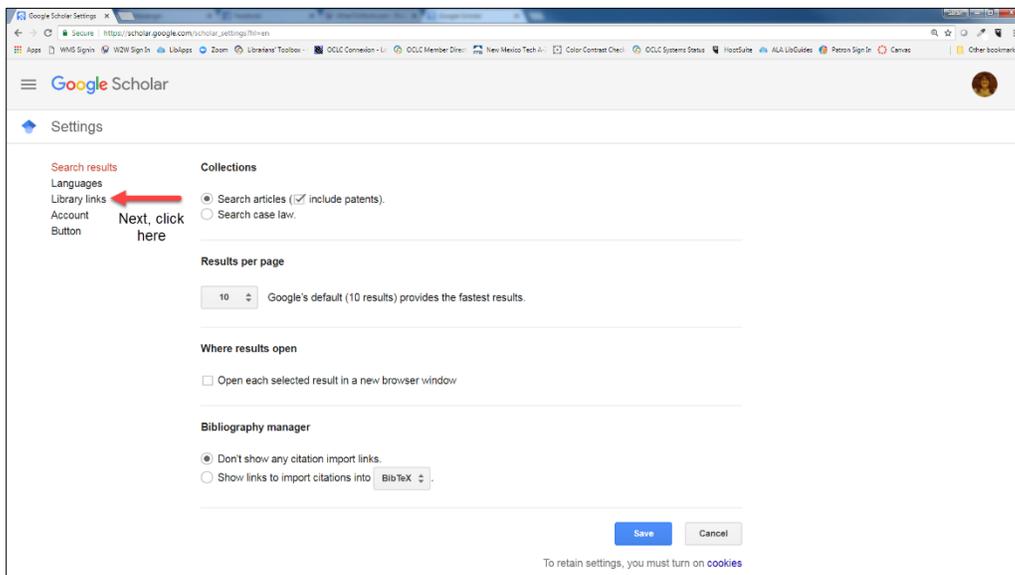
1. Go to scholar.google.com



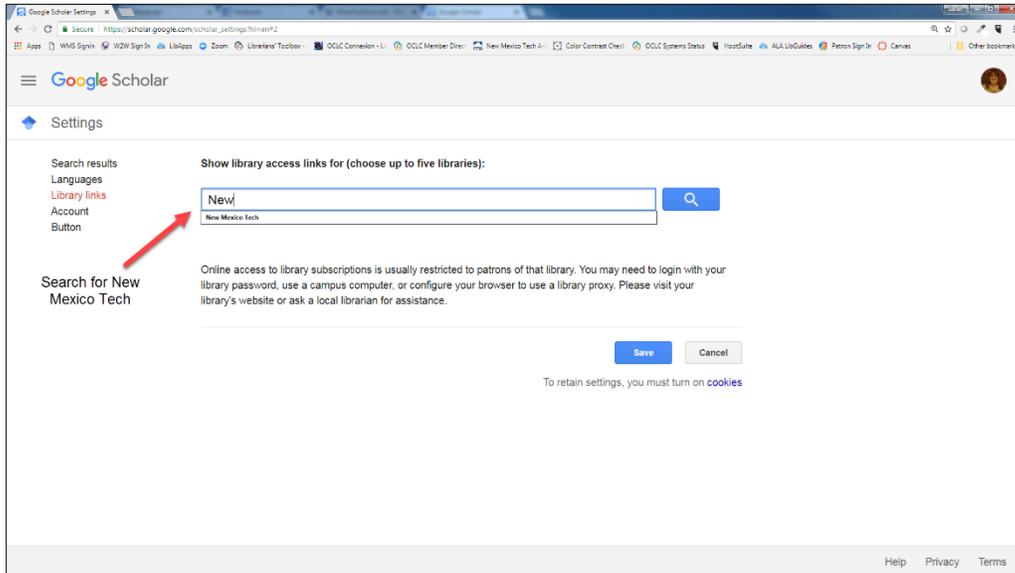
2. Click on your settings



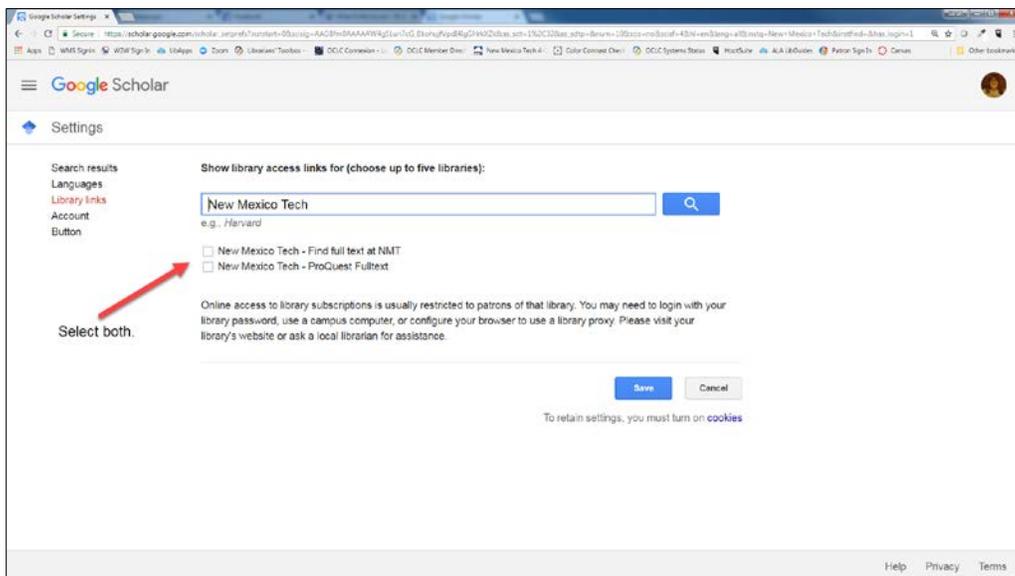
3. Click on **library links**



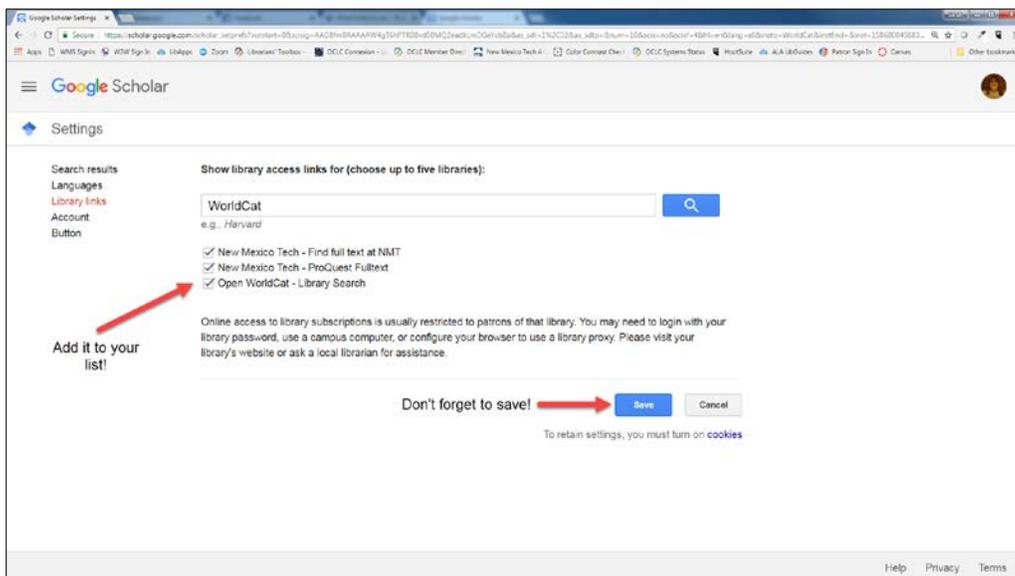
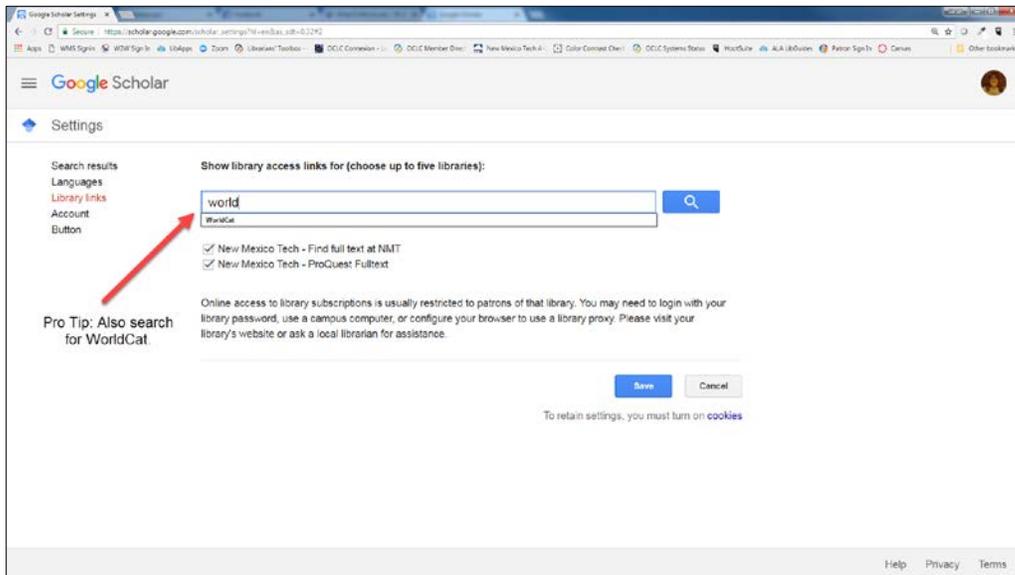
4. Search for **New Mexico Tech** in the search box

6. Repeat steps 2-5 to add **OpenWorldCat – Library Search** search results.
