

Policy on Graduate Student Tuition Remission

Policy Purpose: This policy is to assist with improving the quality of life of New Mexico Tech's graduate students as well as attracting top students to its graduate programs by providing them with competitive salaries and tuition support. Graduate stipends for assistantships and student tuition remissions represent a significant contribution by the University to the education of graduate students, helping to grow the University and produce a highly educated workforce for the future.

POLICY STATEMENT

Tuition remission is available to students in degree-seeking master's or doctoral programs who are enrolled full time and have received graduate assistantships. Eligible students are charged instate tuition, and the tuition remission level is commensurate with the level of the assistantship appointment. Students must receive a minimum stipend level per semester, as set by the Center for Graduate Studies. Stipend levels are subject to change each year. Tuition remission covers tuition only; it does not pay university fees for which each student remains responsible.
