

#### Dear Student Government Association

My name is Isai Mena and I am currently a Senior in the Petroleum Engineering Department at New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology (NMT) and the President of a special club, the Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers (SHPE). This national organization thrives on the idea of empowering the Hispanic community to do great things. What makes our chapter special is our warm and welcoming family that we have created. Our chapter has members of all backgrounds and consists of talented and intelligent individuals that are focused in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). Our chapter has volunteered throughout the Socorro community in multiple ways. We have had the opportunity to host the regional conference for Region 3 of SHPE National. This conference took place on March 2019, right before the pandemic turned our worlds upside down. 300+ attendants had the chance to listen to Tech alumni and staff present at the conference. Our chapter showed what Tech is capable of and represented at a national level. Our members have had the very fun and exciting opportunity to help plan the Hispanci Heritage Fiesta that took place Sept. 25. An event that celebrated the hispanic culture of Socorro. We have hosted resume and networking workshops to prepare our members for the national and regional conferences we attend yearly. These include one-on-one resume editing and interview practicing. Additionally, we have hosted professional SHPE members to talk to our students about professional development and the experience of lating women in STEM. This semester we are excited to finally launch our talk series involving SHPE Alumni from Tech. This talk series hopes to bring alumni and students together with the intention to create an environment of collaboration and professional development. SHPE provides opportunities that are normally unavailable to most students, enable them to network, and ultimately, find a job. In previous years, many of our members who attended this conference received internships and job offers. This conference also serves as an opportunity for our members to meet a mentor in STEM that shares a background similar to their own. Our chapter is strained financially and in great need of assistance. Even with financial adjustments, we are still short from our goal. The next event we have planned is on October 22nd, in which we look to collaborate with other clubs. Other events include a Day of the Dead skull painting, fight night event that is always a success, and lastly Salsa Night on Nov. 18th in conjunction with the Swing Club.

All these events show the desire our chapter has of contributing towards the school and community. While putting on these events, we always look for outside resources. This is why, for all these events, we don't request more than what an event grants the club. If we could make food for our events, we could lessen expenses and provide even more delicious food, but we have to hire Chartwells due to school's commitments. Having good relationships with different campus offices lessens the club's expenses. Some resources, such as the bookstore, can't help us fund a conference trip, but can provide us with prizes for our events. Student Affairs also cooperates by regularly printing our advertising banners free of cost because they support our constant contribution towards the school. The gym is another resource that provides us with machines free of cost in order to make popcorn, cotton candy, or snow cones.

Some members have submitted research papers to the engineering science symposium. Others plan to sign up for the Cybersecurity Challenge. Some of these events come with cash prizes and job opportunities for winners. The following students plan to showcase the quality of New Mexico Tech education.
