4.9 Senate Committees

Relevant Current Language:

- 1. The Senate shall have the power to designate Senate committees as necessary. The Vice President shall appoint all members of Senate committees with the passive consent of the Senate. Following the Vice-Presidential appointments, the floor shall be opened to nominations by the Senate for committee heads. The nominee must be an SGA officer to be eligible as a Committee head.
 - (b) If the Senate rejects the Vice-Presidential recommendation, they are required to give a written request to the Vice President for the changes to be made. If this request is not made, the committees will stand until an alternative is proposed in written form.
 - (e) First-Semester Senators are to be placed in committees at the discretion of the Vice President. These three (3) Senators must all be in separate committees.
 - (f) All committees will follow House Rules.

Proposed Changes:

- 1. The Senate shall have the power to designate Senate committees as necessary. Committee heads shall be nominated by the Senate. The nominee must be an SGA officer. After committee heads have been appointed, the Vice President shall assign all current senators and justices to the formed committees as they deem appropriate.
 - (b) If a committee member rejects their appointment they are required to give a written request to the Vice President for changes to be made.
